PRINCIPLE PARTS: **amor, amari, amatus sum**

amātus, -a, -um *loved (beloved or having been loved)*

1. The translation of the Subjunctive varies widely according to the construction. Hence no translation of this mood is given in the paradigms.
2. **Fui, fuisti**, etc., are sometimes used instead of **sum, es**, etc.; so also **fueram** instead of **eram** and **fuero** instead of **ero**. Similarly, in the Perfect and Pluperfect Subjunctive **fueroim, fueris**, etc. are sometimes used instead of **sim, sis**, etc., and **fuissem** instead of **essem**.
