

1st Conjugation (*ā*-stem) Active Voice

PRINCIPLE PARTS:

amō, amāre, amāvī, amātus

1. The stem-vowel *ā*- is lost before *-ō*, and in the Present Subjunctive becomes *ē*-.

2. The translation of the Subjunctive varies widely according to the construction. Hence no translation of this mood is given in the paradigms.
