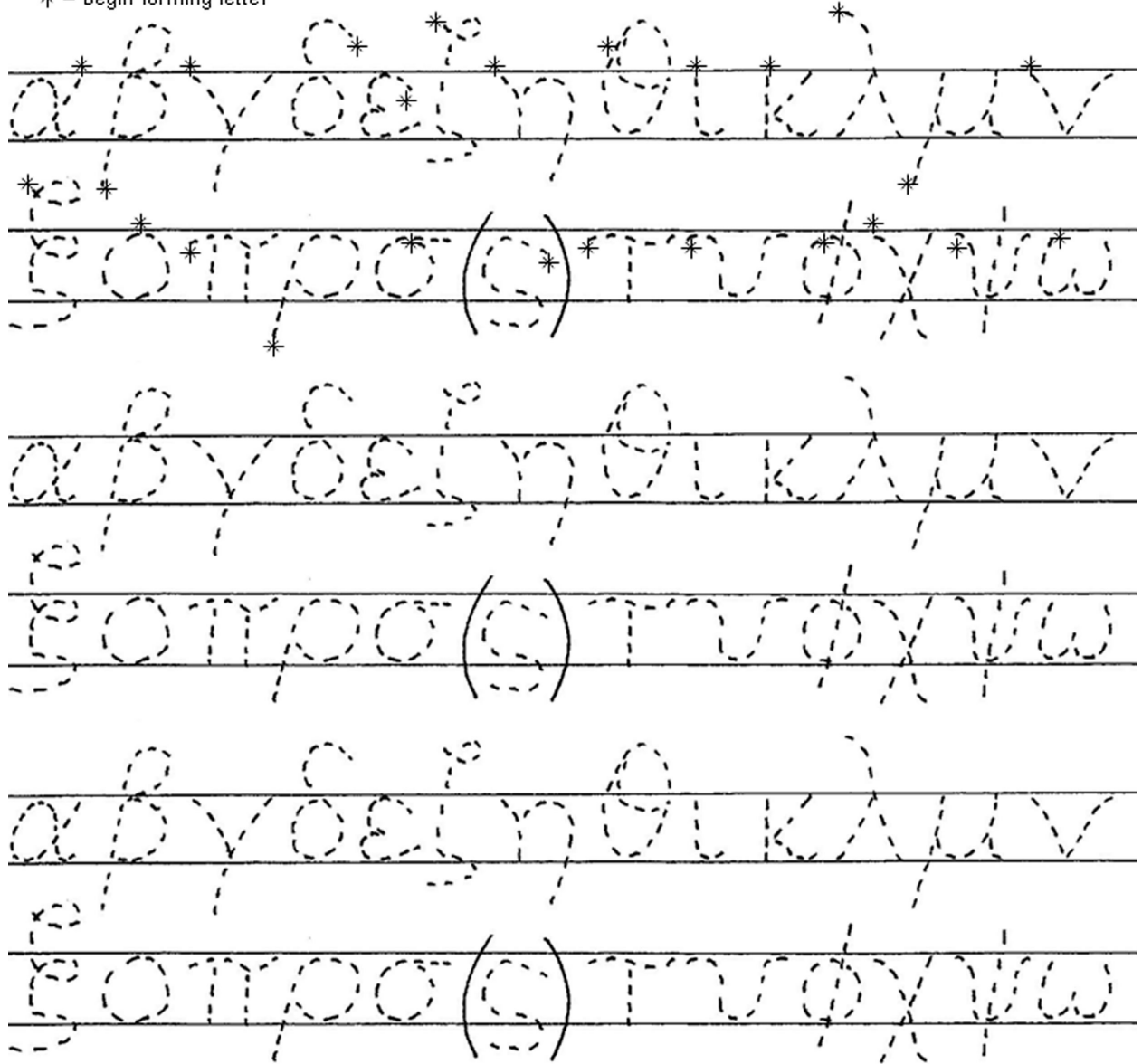


Writing the Greek Letters (Lesson 1, Ex I, Lesson 2, Ex I)
