dēripiō -ripere -ripuī -reptum: snatch away, tear down

dēsistō -sistere -stitī: stand away, withdraw; desist

dīgerō -gerere -gessī -gestum: separate, spread

Diōnē -ēs f.: Dione, the mother of Aphrodite; often used for Aphrodite/Venus herself

dispendium -ī n.: expenditure, expense, loss
dispōnō -pōnere -posuī -positum: arrange, put in place; (mil.) to post, station
docilis -e: teachable, responsive (to styling)
emō emere ēmī emptum: buy, purchase
ēradiō -rudīre -rudī -rudītum: to instruct, train; free from roughness
ferreus -a -um: made of iron; hard-hearted, cruel
filum -ī n.: thread, string
flexus -ūs m.: curl, wave; the act of bending or curling
formōsus -a -um: shapely, beautiful
gena -ae f.: cheek
Germānia -ae f.: Germany
gracilis -e: slender, thin
grāmen -inis n.: grass, plant, herb
gremium -ī n.: lap
Haemonius, -a, -um: Haemonian, Thessalian
herba -ae f.: herb
Īda -ae f.: Mount Ida
immemor -oris: unmindful, forgetful
ineptus -a -um: foolish
ingenuus -a -um: tender, delicate

reparābilis -e: repairable, recoverable
rubeō -ēre: redden, blush
rubor -ōris m.: redness of face, a feeling of shame
saucius -a -um: wounded
