dīviduus -a -um: divided

femur -oris n.: thigh

fenestra -ae f.: window

formōsus -a -um: shapely, beautiful

iuvenālis -e: youthful

lacertus -ī m.: the arm, esp. the upper arm

Lāis -idis or -idos f.: Lais, the name of two famous Greek courtesans

lassus -a -um: tired, weary

latebra -ae f.: hiding place, concealment

laudābilis -e: praiseworthy, laudable

levō -āre: lighten, relieve

menda -ae f.: fault, defect, blemish

nūsquam: (adv.) nowhere

papilla -ae f.: nipple, breast

Phoebus -ī m.: Apollo

plānus -a -um: flat, level

prōditiō -ōnis f.: betrayal, abandonment (of a cause)

prōveniō -venīre -vēnī -ventūrum: come forth; come about

recingō -cingere -cinxī -cīnctum: ungird, loosen

requiēscō -quiēscere -quiēvī -quiētum: rest, repose

Samīramis -idis f.: Samiramis, a legendary queen of Assyria

**sublūceō -lūcēre:** shine faintly, glimmer, gleam

**thalamus -ī m.:** marriage bed; bedchamber

**timidus -a -um:** fearful, timid, shy

**torum -ī n.:** bed, couch, cushion

**tunica -ae f.:** tunic

**umerus -ī m.:** shoulder

**vēlāmen -inis n.:** covering, garment

**vēlō -āre:** cover, clothe

**venter -ris m.:** stomach, belly
