1. Ferō has two independent stems: **fer-** in the present system, and **tul-** (for **tol-**) in the perfect from TOL, root of **tollō**. The perfect **tetuli** occurs in Plautus. In the participle the root is weakened to **tl-**, **lātum** standing for †**tlātum** (cf. τλητός)
2. **Ferre, ferrem**, are for †**fer-se**, †**fer-sēm** (cf. **es-se, es-sem**), **s** being assimilated to preceding **r**; or **ferre, ferrem**, may be for †**ferese**, †**feresēm** (see § 15.4).
